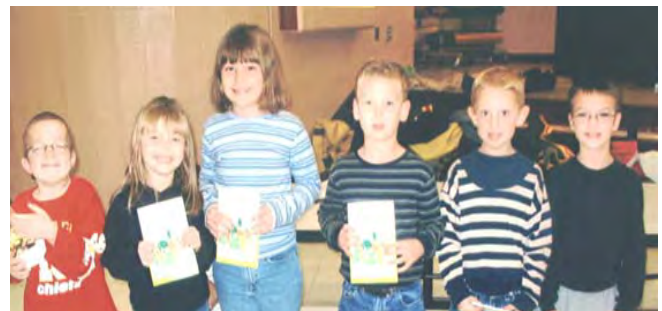
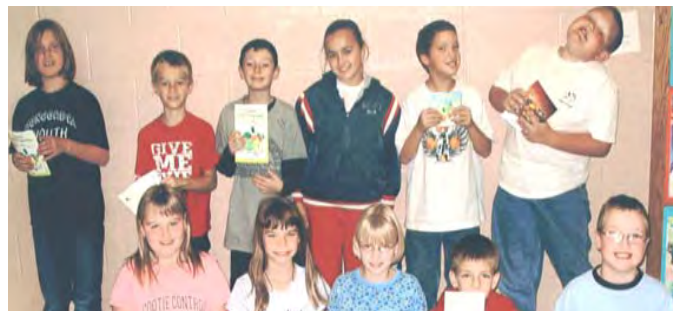
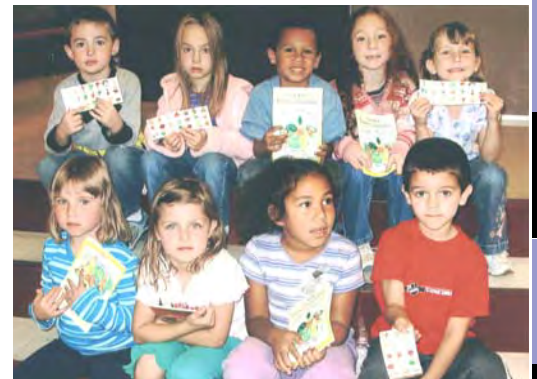

U.S.D. 333 staff asked questions about many issues, including the rationale for hiring the new commissioner, state science standards, reasons for developing new policy for vouchers and charter schools, explanations for the emphasis on school choice through competition, and state assessment procedures.

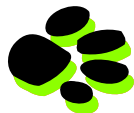

CES COUNSELING

Counseling classes in first, second, third, and fourth grade are starting Unit II of the Second Step Violence Prevention Program. It focuses on impulse control and problem solving. Impulse control means slowing down and thinking rather than doing the first thing that pops into your head.

Problem solving is a strategy for dealing with problems we face with other people and as individuals. There are five steps in the problem solving model.

What is the problem?

What are some solutions?

For each solution, ask yourself:

Is it safe?

How might people feel?

Is it fair?

Will it work?

Choose a solution and use it.

Is it working?

Yes!

If not, what can I do now? (Go back to step 4)

Calming-down techniques are taught to give your child the skills to compose him or herself so that a given problem can be solved more effectively. There are three steps to calming down.

Stop and think.

Ask yourself: How does my body feel?

Try:

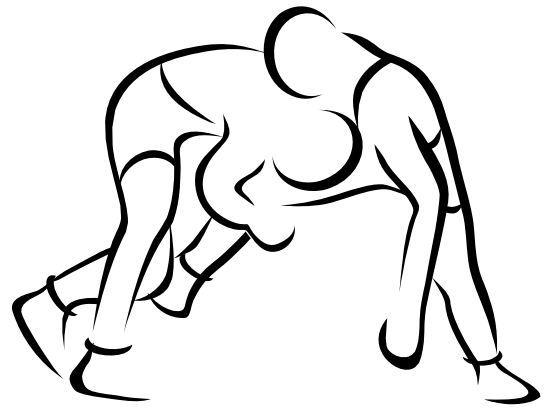
Taking three deep breaths

Counting backward slowly

Thinking calming thoughts

Talking to yourself

Our class will learn and practice steps for calming down and solving problems. In this unit, your child will also practice using such skills as apologizing, ignoring distractions, and dealing with peer pressure.

More teachers have been featured in the CES Library this year as part of the Book Nook.



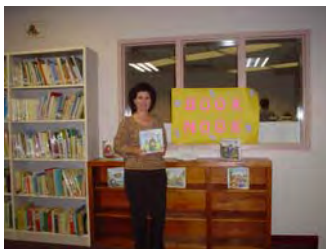
Mrs. Chris Fall, CES Principal
