“Rachel’s Challenge” Coming Soon

On December 7th, USD 333 will be hosting “Rachel’s Challenge” in our schools and in the community. Rachel Scott was a sixteen year old junior at Columbine High School on the day that the shootings began. She was the first student killed.

Rachel went out of her way to show kindness and compassion to others. She once wrote in an English paper, “I have this theory that if one person can go out of their way to show compassion then it will start a chain reaction of the same. People will never know how far a little kindness can go.” She believed that everyone deserved at least three chances, that we should not be so judgmental of others. Instead, look for the good that lies within each of us.

Rachel’s Challenge is a national campaign designed to help school administrators, parents and students create safer and more productive places to learn and achieve. The goal is to motivate and equip students to embrace new values of kindness and compassion so that no child is left behind. Her challenge is an effort to fight against the name calling and bullying that occurs not only in our schools, but in our communities and within our places of work as well. This is a program for everyone!

We are fortunate to have Rachel’s sister, Dana Scott, as our presenter on December 7th. She will share a program with 5th through 8th graders at 8:30 in the High School auditorium. At 10:30, she will share the story with high school students in grades 9 through 12. Several students from surrounding schools have also been invited and will be attending. At 1:30, Dana will be working with 50 students from Concordia who have been selected as the Friends of Rachel Leadership Team in a training session learning positive ways to keep the chain going.

Since this is not just a school problem and not just a student problem, Dana will be sharing Rachel’s Challenge with the entire community in an evening presentation at the Brown Grand Theatre at 7:00. This is a **FREE** presentation open to everyone. Please mark your calendars and plan to attend.

Over 400 students from the North Central District auditioned that day, which includes all high schools in Republic, Cloud, Ottawa, Saline, Washington, Clay, Dickinson, Marshall, Pottawatomie, Riley, Geary, Morris, Chase, Wabaunsee, and Lyon Counties.

15 students from CHS were selected to the 2006 District Honor Choir. Gifted Field Trip to Stuhr Museum

October 30th, the gifted students in grades six through eight took a trip to the Stuhr Museum in Grand Island, NE. They completed a simulation called "Pioneer Living". Students were dropped off at an authentic 1890's working farm complete with a Victorian farmhouse and the work hand house. The group split with half the student going with Grandma Annie to the farmhouse and the other half going to the hired man's house. While at the house, they spent the morning doing the chores a typical child their age would complete. This included hauling wood, bringing in water, watering the garden, and other activities. They also cooked an authentic meal from scratch. They made stew, cornbread muffins, and corncob jelly. Students husked the corn, ground the corn, and made the mix. The food was all prepared using a wood cook stove. The students also learned that very little was wasted or thrown away in an 1890's household. Everything was recycled. Student also learned about respect and etiquette of the time period. Grandma Annie also told them many stories about "soddies" and about why people settled on the prairie. Students commented that their favorite part of the trip was the homemade food. They were quite surprised how filling it was. When asked what they liked least, they commented that they did not like using the authentic bathroom facilities.

Parents As Teachers

Our local Parents as Teachers program is sponsored by the Learning Cooperative of North Central Kansas and the following school districts: USD #333 Concordia, USD #224 Clifton/Clyde, USD #426 Pike Valley, and USD #109 Republic County. Our Parents As Teachers program works with soon-to-be parents and families with children between the ages of birth and three. Certified parent educators offer parents practical ways to encourage learning, manage challenging behavior and promote strong parent-child relationships. The Parents as Teachers program is free and participation is voluntary. Families who enroll in the program benefit from group meetings for parents to enhance their parenting knowledge, monthly playgroups, periodic child screenings for vision, hearing and overall development, and referrals to a network of community services. However, Parents as Teachers is often best known for its personal visits during which parent educators meet one-on-one with families to discuss a child's specific needs and development.

To become a certified parent educator one must have a college degree in early childhood or related field and successfully complete Parents as Teachers National Center trainings to work with and provide parents with time-tested, expert-based information and techniques for enriching and encouraging a child's development. Parents as Teachers is not funded by or meant to promote any given agenda other than to provide parents from all walks of life with the information and skills they need to be their child's best, first teacher and role model. More than a dozen independent studies over 25 years have verified the effectiveness of the Parents as Teachers model, known as Born to Learn. Studies show that Parents as Teachers children have higher levels of school readiness and continue to outperform their peers in first through fourth grades.

In the first few years, children learn more and at a faster pace than at any other time in life. Parents and caregivers help shape a child's future through the kinds of experiences they provide. The Parents As Teachers mission is to provide the information, support, and encouragement parents need to help their children develop optimally during the crucial early years of life.
