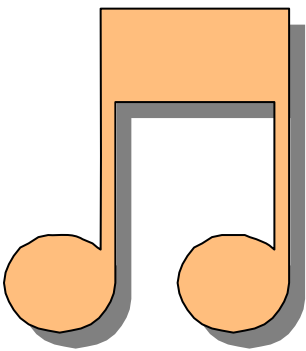

ACADEMIC AWARDS

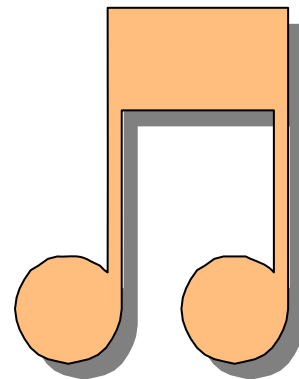

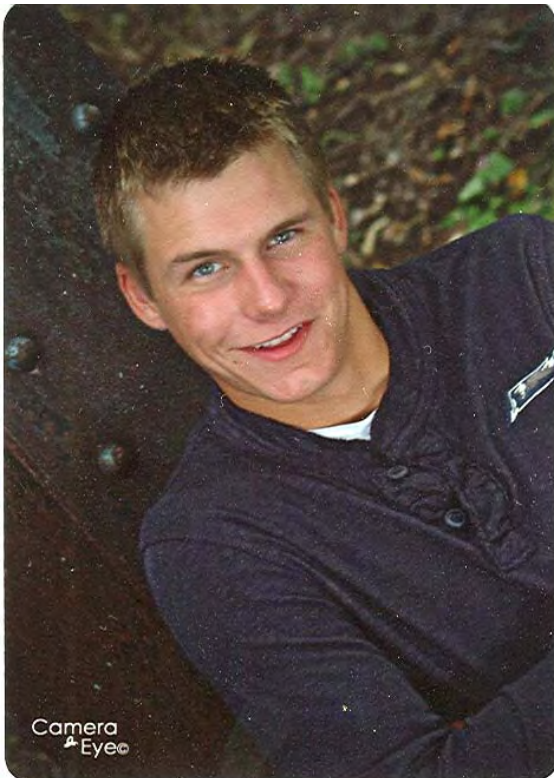
